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The TN/KY AUSA Chapter will award scholarships to graduating high-school seniors whose parents are members of the TN/KY AUSA Chapter.

Scholarships will be based on academic achievement, personal achievement and community involvement-not financial need. They may be used for tuition, books, room, board and fees charged by academic institution.

Instructions and Procedures

1. **TO BE ELIGIBLE, APPLICANT MUST BE A DEPENDENT OF A TN/KY AUSA CHAPTER MEMBER.**
2. The applicant must be a high-school senior who will complete requirements for graduation between January and June 2009.
3. The applicant is to attend college or vocational school during the academic year 2009-2010.
4. Attach an official sealed transcript of your grades covering the first seven semesters of high school. Include your ACT or SAT and Achievement test scores.
5. Two Scholarship Applicant Profiles (use attached forms) must be included with the application. Once profile should be from one of your high-school teachers and the other profile should be from a person of your choice, not related to you.
6. Completed application packets must be **postmarked no later than April 30, 2009** and mailed to:

7. Do not put your name on pages 2-5 or on the essay pages.
8. Incomplete applications will be disqualified. It is your responsibility to ensure that the application is complete and on time. On a separate sheet of paper please write an essay addressing the question:

“How have your experiences on military bases prepared you for a life on your future college campus? What challenges, if any, do you anticipate? How have your past experiences prepared you for handling these challenges?”

Answer must be typed, double-spaced, and be **200-300 words** in length. Please re-type the question you answer at the top of the page. **Do not put your name on the essay. Please attach the essay to this cover sheet.**
