

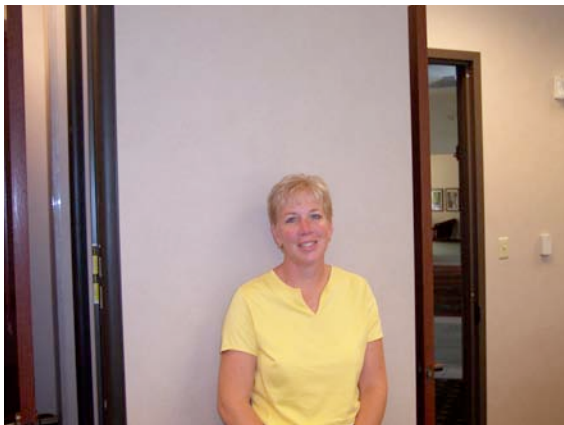

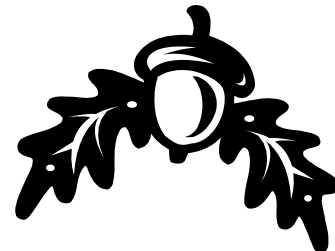
MG Turner presents Eagle Trophy and plaques to 716th MP Battalion for Fourth Quarter, FY04.
