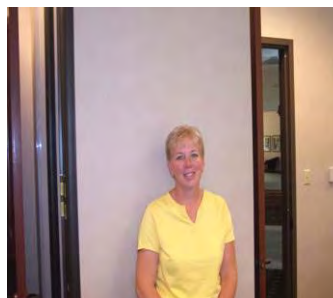

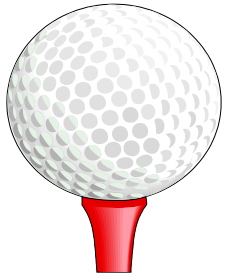
In the Spotlight
